

#### **1a) Restart Progress**


	Types of Application	No. of Applications Approved (as of 12 Jul)	
1	Construction projects	2,430	
2	Renovation works	51,369	
3	Construction Account Works (eg. FM, L&E)	22,675	

- More than 1,800 projects have used the self-help tool to assess their restart readiness
- Main contractors are encouraged to apply for restart while waiting for workers to be cleared
- COVID Safe workers training: < 328,000 passed to date
- SMO Course: >39,000\* SMO trained to date

[ICYMI] Dormitories cleared of COVID-19
23 June 2020 - MOM's Press Release

31 more dorms have been cleared of COVID-19. These comprise 27 Factory-Converted Dorms & 4 Construction Temporary Quarters. In addition, 4 Blocks for Recovered Workers (BRWs) in 3 Purpose-Built Dorms (PBD) have been cleared. These residences house about 3,700 residents.












Worksites are potential "hubs" of virus transmission leading to multiple clusters


#### **Major COVID+ Outbreak at Project Glory**



- Largest construction site cluster linked to 6 dorms
- Work at site was halted

#### More Recent C+ Outbreak at a Project Site (non-construction)

- 6 COVID+ cases were first confirmed among a team working in the Middle work-zone
- Causes: Workers from different work-zones sharing (i) common lunch and rest areas, (ii) transportation and (iii) residences



Risk of spread from middle to East and West workzone

#### <u>Actions Taken – Stop Work Order (SWO)</u>

- Quarantine Orders (QO) issued to **356 close contacts**
- MOH served SWO, site closure and disinfection
- Locked down entire block of residence with some workers conveyed to GQFs

#### **Key Lessons Learnt**

- Cohort workers according to work zones, stagger the use of common lunch and rest areas
- No mixing of different cohorts during transportation and in places of residence to prevent cross infection

### Top safety breaches from BCA's Inspection Findings

Top breaches observed	Large Projects (>\$3mil)	Small Projects (<\$3mil)
Workers yet to receive BCA's approval but started working on site	25	77
SafeEntry (NRIC version) not installed and used	26	70
Missing Safe Management Measures (SMM) plan on site	17	57
Safety Management Officer (SMO) not on site	5	34
Meals not individually packed	11	24

BCA will take enforcement actions against work sites with breaches:-

- Stern Warnings
- Safety Time-out
- Stop Work Orders (SWO)
- Composition Fines
- Prosecution

#### **Reporting Unsafe Practices in Worksites**

#### 'Whistle blowing'

- Poster with QR code for workers to report non-compliances
- Worksites will be required to display posters
- PMs and SMOs will be briefed
- Mass SMS to inform workers of such channel

• BCA would continue to engage the industry to ensure a COVID-Safe restart through:

#### **Sharing Session with Project Managers and SMOs of New Restart Projects**

- Conducted 1<sup>st</sup> session with 82 PMs/SMOs via Zoom on 20 Jun
- Received feedback that BCA's briefing was a good platform with opportunities to learn and clarify queries

#### **Continuous Efforts to Increase Awareness on Effective Site Management**

- Improve clarity of requirements via briefings, submission guides, FAQ
- Provide guidance to builders and SMOs prior to audits
- Share inspection checklist with SMOs
- Conduct regular briefing/dialogue to share BCA's inspection findings & good practices


MOM released improved features to the AccessCode on 12 July:


AccessCode colours simplified to **Green** and **Red** codes only, and the Grey code would be removed.



Scan the QR Code



- Can leave dormitory for work

- Residence is cleared

### 2b) Safe Workforce — Updates to AccessCode

MOM released improved features to the AccessCode on 12 July:

Employers would be able to check their workers' (S Pass or WPH) AccessCode details through the new Safe@Work eService




### 2b) Safe Workforce — Updates to AccessCode

MOM released improved features to the AccessCode on 12 July:

Workers would now be able to find out why their AccessCode is 'Red' by scanning the QR code on their work pass cards or tapping on the coloured bar.





#### 2c) COVID-Safe Accommodation & Transport — Updates on Dorm Clearance

- As of 7 Jul, 384 more dorms have been cleared bringing the total number to 625 dorms and 44 blocks of recovered workers in 17 PBDs.
- About 180,000 workers have either recovered or been cleared:
  - Some are pending movement to appropriate accommodations prior to work resumption; and
  - Others can resume work once dorm operators, employers and workers have made the necessary preparations (Eg. Dorm operators to arrange staggered pick-up/drop-off, employers to confirm/update workers' addresses on MOM's database etc)

#### 3) Use of Technology to Support Implementation of COVID-Safe Measures

- In order to safeguard project progress and community's interest in preventing resurgence of infection, it is key for *industry to take ownership in implementing and enforcing COVID-Safe measures*.
- BCA has developed a system (BuildSG-CovidSafe Platform) to aid firms in adopting technology to achieve a
  Covid-Safe restart.

#### **COVID-SAFE EMPLOYERS ASSISTED BY TECHNOLOGY**

#### **COVID-SAFE WORKFORCE**

Workers are clean (COVID-19 free) and remain clean; Basis for COVID-Safe Worksite and Worker Accommodation/Transport

#### **COVID-SAFE WORKSITE**

Safe Management Measures (SMM)
Implemented and enforced at sites

# COVID-SAFE WORKER ACCOMMODATION/TRANSPORT

SMM in accommodation; Dedicated transport to/from workplace

#### **AUDIT AND INSPECTION (A&I) ENABLED BY TECHNOLOGY**

Firms to appoint Safe Management Officers (SMOs) and Safe Distancing Officers (SDO) aided by technology for tracking, surveillance and tracing

#### 3) Use of Technology to Support Implementation of COVID-Safe Measures

#### Examples

## COVID-SAFE EMPLOYERS and A&I ASSISTED BY TECHNOLOGY:

#### Worksite access control:

- Facial biometric recognition
- Thermal scanner
- System would verify and record workers' details (i.e. ID, temperature,
   SafeEntry registration etc)

#### Remote monitoring to ensure SDM and Segregation of Workers:

- **Al Camera** Image analysis to capture SMM breaches
- **Contact Tracing Wearables** Identify close contact of segregated cohorts
- **Inspection Apps** Online documentation of findings from inspection
- **Data Assisted & Compliance System** Identify high risk areas, common non-compliance trends etc
- ✓ Firms could tap on IMDA's Advanced Digital Solutions (ADS) initiative to fund the adoption of COVID-Safe Technologies More details to be provided soon
